The Planning Board, having duly completed the legal requirements under which this Board considers zone changes herewith transmits the required documents in this case, i. e. petition of James and Maude Somerville for a change in zone at 226-226A Broadway.

The petitioners have admitted that it is their intention to sell their property to the White Tower Corporation. Mr. Thomas Feeney, Vice President of the White Tower Corporation testified that it was the intention of the Company to demolish the house and use the land for parking of customer cars.

Since the property is a part of a relatively stable residential section, the Planning Board is of the opinion that an extension of the business zone to include the lot, now allegedly in the ownership of the Somervilles, could serve no useful purpose and would constitute a denial of earlier decisions made by the Planning Board in the preparation of the 1960 Zoning Ordinance.

Mr. Feeney's testimony brought out the fact that no further expansion of the building is contemplated, that the recent addition of three new booths in the building did not substantially increase the parking requirements. Accordingly it is the opinion of this Board that the present parking facilities are adequate for ordinary business, since Mr. Feeney indicated that parking was of short duration, and that no "car hops" were to be employed.

The Planning Board recommends that the petition be denied.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF 1929  
BY STRIKING OUT CHAPTER XXXVI RELATIVE TO TAXI CABS,  
TAXI STANDS AND TAXI OPERATORS AND INSERTING A NEW  
CHAPTER XXXVI.

103810

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Somerville, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Revised Ordinances of 1929, as amended, are hereby further amended by striking out Chapter XXXVI relative to Taxi Cabs, Taxi Stands and Taxi Operators and inserting in place thereof, a new Chapter XXXVI relative to Taxi Cabs, Taxi Stands and Taxi Operators, as follows:

TAXI CABS

SECTION 1. Every vehicle used or to be used for the conveyance of persons for hire from place to place, within the city of Somerville, shall be deemed to be a taxi cab within the meaning of this ordinance except a street railway car or a trackless trolley vehicle within the meaning of General Laws, Chapter 163, Section 2, or a motor vehicle, commonly known as a jitney, operated in a manner and for the purposes stated in General Laws, Chapter 159, Section 45, or a sight-seeing automobile, as defined in Statutes of 1913, Chapter 592, Section 1, or a motor vehicle used for funeral and wedding purposes only.

SECTION 2. No person shall drive or have charge of a taxi cab, nor shall any person or corporation set up and use a taxi cab unless licensed thereto by the Board of Aldermen.

No owner or person having the care or ordering of a taxi cab shall suffer or allow any person other than a driver licensed by the Board of Aldermen to drive such taxi cab.

SECTION 3. Any person or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding twenty dollars for each offense; and any licensed owner or driver who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, in addition to said penalty, thereupon become liable to forfeit his license and be disqualified to hold a license thereafter.

SECTION 4. The Board of Aldermen may grant licenses to suitable persons, who are owners of such vehicles, to set up and use them as taxi cabs, and all persons who are qualified as drivers, and in other respects, to drive and have charge of taxi cabs.

Such licenses will be given subject to such terms, conditions and regulations, and upon the payment of such fees, as the Board of Aldermen shall, from time to time, prescribe in general orders or otherwise.

SECTION 5. New applications for licenses and for permits for stands may be filed with the Board of Aldermen at any time, but applications for the renewal of licenses and permits already in force shall be filed annually in April. They shall be made on official forms provided by the Board and shall contain all the information therein required. All licenses and permits shall become void on the first day of May annually, except such as are granted in April as valid for the year beginning on the next succeeding first day of May.

SECTION 6. No person shall be licensed to be a driver or an owner of a taxi cab unless he can read, write and speak the English language intelligently.

SECTION 7. Taxi cabs licensed by the Board of Aldermen shall be licensed and registered in accordance with Chapter 90 of Massachusetts General Laws, from their principal place of garaging, which place shall be within the geographical confines of the city of Somerville.

SECTION 8. No license or permit provided for in this ordinance shall be sold, assigned, or transferred without the consent of the Board of Aldermen in writing; and any licensee who shall cease to be the owner or the driver of a taxi cab shall at once surrender his license to the Board of Aldermen. <sup>leased</sup>

SECTION 9. Not more than one taxi cab license shall be issued for each One Thousand Five Hundred (1,500) inhabitants or fraction thereof, except that if a greater number of such licenses shall have been granted, issued or in force at the time of the taking effect of this Section than would be permissible under said limitation, such licenses may be granted equal in number to those granted, issued and in force upon the taking effect of this Section, but no additional licenses shall be granted above the number in force upon the taking effect of this Section until the number of such licenses shall correspond to the limitation provided herein.

SECTION 10. When a licensed owner, changes his address or the place at which a taxi cab owned by him is kept, or when a licensed driver changes his home address, his place of employment or his employer, he shall, within three days of such change notify the Board of Aldermen.

SECTION 11. No vehicle shall be set up in front of any premises without the written consent of the owner or the agent of the owner, and the occupant of said premises.

SECTION 12. The Board of Aldermen will designate certain places to be used as assigned stands by taxi cabs not exceeding at any one time the number specified for each place. Owners or drivers of taxi cabs shall not trespass upon stands to which they have not been assigned.

Every motor vehicle to be used as a taxicab in the City of Somerville shall have the words, "Taxi", "Cab" or "Taxicab" printed on the body of the vehicle in letters not less than three inches in height, and shall have a number, commencing with the numeral one painted in letters not less than three inches in height under the window on the back of each taxicab.

All such taxicab stands shall be properly marked by painted lines, and signs erected showing the number of taxicabs for which the space is reserved, and said lines and signs shall be made by the Highway Department.

SECTION 13. Licensed drivers will answer fully and civilly any questions put to them by police officers in the performance of their duty.

SECTION 14. Every person having charge of a taxi cab shall at all times carry with him his license, a copy of the rates of fare established and a copy of the rules and regulations, and shall exhibit them to any passenger or police officer on demand. He shall not demand from any passenger more than the established rate of fare. When in a public place he shall not refuse, unless previously engaged, or unless the conditions are such as those described in the next succeeding paragraph, to carry any passenger lawfully entitled to be carried in a taxi cab.

SECTION 15. Any person refusing to pay, or attempting to avoid payment of such fare, shall forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding twenty dollars for each offense.

SECTION 16. The Board of Aldermen will hold as unsuited to hold a license any driver who gives direction, information or service to a man or woman seeking a place or a person for immoral purposes, or any driver who offers such direction, information or service. They will regard as unsuited to hold a license any driver who continues to convey from place to place a person who is noisy or otherwise disorderly, or who conveys a person who is intoxicated, even though not disorderly, except directly to the place where the driver has reason to believe is the passenger's house, lodging or other abiding place; but this provision shall not apply to cases in which persons are conveyed by direction of a police officer. When a passenger becomes noisy or otherwise disorderly while in a taxi cab and persists in such conduct, after warning, the driver may appeal to any policeman who shall assist him in any lawful way and, if in the possession of the necessary evidence, shall prosecute the offending passenger. The police shall observe with particular care the matters to which this section relates and report thereon.

**SECTION 17.** Every person having charge of a taxi cab in a public place shall wear on the left breast of his outside coat, or on the front of its collar just above, the number of his license in Arabic figures not less than one inch in length. The figures must be one of the patterns approved by the Chief of Police. They must be worn upright, and so placed as to be easily read from the front, whether the licensed person be on foot or on his vehicle.

**SECTION 18.** No person having the charge, care or ordering of any taxi cab, except an omnibus, shall take up or carry any passenger after the cab has been occupied or engaged by any prior passenger until such prior passenger, shall have discharged said carriage without the consent of such prior passenger. Any such prior passenger shall not be obliged or requested to pay any extra fare or fee for refusing such consent.

**SECTION 19.** Every person having charge of a taxi cab shall immediately after delivering any passenger search said cab for any property which may have been left therein, and any property found therein by any person having the care or ordering of any taxi cab, and not restored to the owner thereof within forty-eight hours, shall be delivered by the finder thereof to the Police Department.

**SECTION 20.** No person having charge of a taxi cab shall solicit passengers except by a motion of the hand, nor in any public way or place except when such taxi cab is rightfully standing upon some assigned stand; nor shall he suffer or allow any person to ride upon the driver's seat of a taxi cab, except when the seats inside the cab are fully occupied, and then only when the person so riding is a genuine passenger.

**SECTION 21.** No owner, driver or other person having the care or ordering of any licensed taxi cab shall suffer the same to stop in any street, square, lane or alley of this City more than five minutes, without some proper person to take care of the same, or more than twenty minutes in any case; provided, however, that nothing in this section shall be taken to apply to licensed taxi cabs rightfully standing upon assigned stands.

**SECTION 22.** Every driver of any licensed taxi cab shall remain near to such vehicle while it is unemployed, or standing in the streets or squares of the City, unless he shall be necessarily absent therefrom in the course of his duty and business as such driver; and he shall so keep his vehicle that it shall not obstruct said streets or squares or other public passages, or in any other manner violate the law, or the ordinances of the Board of Aldermen.

**SECTION 23.** Every person having charge of a taxi cab shall obey the directions of any police officer respecting the standing of such vehicle while waiting for passengers and the route to be taken in going to or from the place of standing.

**SECTION 24.** No person having charge of any taxi cab shall receive or permit to be placed therein, nor convey in or upon the same, any person sick or infected with any contagious disease, or the body of any person deceased from such disease.

**SECTION 25.** The owners and drivers of taxi cabs propelled by mechanical motors shall be subject to all the provisions of the preceding sections of this ordinance, and shall be subject also to the following special provisions:-

(a) An applicant for a license as owner of a motor taxi cab shall present for examination in the case of each car a valid certificate of registration issued by the Registrar of Motor Vehicles, the date of which together with the car number shall be entered on the application and also on the license of the Board of Aldermen, if granted.

(b) An applicant for a license to drive a motor taxi cab shall present for examination a valid license as a chauffeur issued to him by the Registrar of Motor Vehicles, and the date and the number thereof shall be entered on the application, and also on the license of the Board of Aldermen.

(c) Notice in writing shall be given to the Board of Aldermen by licensed owners and chauffeurs, as the case may be, immediately upon any change in residence or employment, or in the place at which a car is kept, or upon any change in the certificate of registration, the license to operate or the car number as issued by the Registrar of Motor Vehicles.

(d) Owners and drivers of motor taxi cabs shall be subject in their equipment and operation to all provisions of the statutes relating to automobiles now or hereafter in effect.

#### MOTOR TAXICABS

SECTION 26 - RATES. The price or rates of fare which drivers of taxicabs, propelled by mechanical motors and using taxi-meters as the means of measuring the distance travelled, to be known as "Motor Taxicabs" may charge and demand for services rendered in conveying passengers are as follows: -- From point to point within the City limits, the initial money drop shall be 45 cents and shall cover the cost of the first quarter of a mile, or fraction thereof, or the first two minutes of waiting time or a combination of both. Each one-quarter (or fraction thereof) of a mile thereafter ten (10) cents.

Waiting time shall include all time during which the vehicle is not in motion, beginning five minutes after its arrival at the place to which it has been called. Waiting time charges shall be ten cents for each two minutes except for the initial money drop. No charge shall be made for time between a premature arrival in response to a call and the time for which the vehicle was ordered, nor for time attributable to a breakdown of the vehicle. Waiting time charges shall be made for time lost through interruption of traffic, with the exception of such time lost through the operation of the opening and closing of draw-bridges and the passage of railroad trains.

SECTION 27. The owner of a licensed taxi cab must keep on a form approved by the Police Chief and produce upon demand of the Police Chief a record showing time of all trips made by said vehicle and containing all information requested on a form approved by the Police Chief for a period of each calendar day, said forms to be held for ninety days.

SECTION 28. Hand baggage may be carried by passengers without charge. The carriage of trunks shall be optional with the person in charge of the vehicle; but, if carried, the charge shall be fifty cents for each trunk.

SECTION 29. When a motor taxicab is hired by the hour or for a trip wholly or in part outside the limits of the City of Somerville, the person in charge may suspend, with the consent of the passenger, the use of the taximeter as a means of determining the price to be paid. In such cases the price shall be agreed upon between the persons in charge of the automobile and the passenger.

SECTION 30. Every motor vehicle licensed as a taxi cab in and by the City of Somerville, except motor vehicles used for funeral and wedding purposes only, shall have affixed thereto a standard taximeter of a size and design approved by the Board of Aldermen. Every motor vehicle so licensed as a taxi cab with a taximeter attached for measuring the distance travelled shall be known as a taxicab, and no such taxicab shall be operated without using the said taximeter attached thereto for measuring the fare to be charged for each trip. For any violation of this provision by failure to attach such taximeter, or by failure to use such taximeter as a measuring device for any trip undertaken under said taxicab license or within the City of Somerville, the taxi cab license of the owner and operator of any taxi cab violating this provision shall be revoked by the Board of Aldermen. Other penalties for violation of this Section may be prescribed by the Board of Aldermen. No vehicle shall be licensed as a taxi cab until the taxi meter attached thereto shall have been inspected by the proper authority and found to be accurate in accordance with the provisions of Section 45 of Chapter 98 of the General Laws concerning the sealing of taxi meters on vehicles used for hire. After sundown the face of every taxi meter shall be illuminated by a suitable light so arranged as to throw a continuous steady light thereon. No fare for carriage of persons in such a taxicab shall exceed the amount shown upon the face of the taxi meter thereon.

SECTION 31. All trade names used by licensed owners shall be approved by the Board of Aldermen and recorded in the Office of the City Clerk.

Any licensee who shall cease to be the owner of a taxi cab shall at once surrender his license to the City Clerk.

The Chief of Police may recommend refusal of a license for, or if already issued, recommend revocation or suspension of the license of any taxi cab found by him in his sound discretion to be unfit or unsuited for public patronage.

SECTION 32. No owner of a licensed taxicab shall paint his vehicle in colors or designs to so closely resemble other licensed taxicabs as to mislead the public as to its identity.

SECTION 33. All taxi cabs must be kept in good condition, suitable for occupancy and mechanically fit for the safety of passengers. The interior and exterior shall be clean and sanitary at all times.

All taxi cabs shall be thoroughly cleaned, inspected and repaired by the owner at least once each week.

SECTION 34. The Chief of Police shall assign a superior officer and such other officers as he shall deem necessary to enforce the regulations set forth in this ordinance.

SECTION 35. All complaints and violations of these rules against taxi cab drivers and owners by the public or police officers shall be brought before the Chief of Police who shall hear the facts, and if the taxi cab driver or owner is found guilty of the complaint or violation, the Chief of Police may recommend to the Board of Aldermen, that the said license of owner or driver shall be suspended or revoked. If the owner of any taxi cab is found guilty of the offense charged while he is driving the said taxi cab, the Chief of Police may recommend that the license of the said taxi cab shall be suspended or revoked, in addition to any action that may be taken in regard to his driver's license, and said taxi cab shall not be used during said period of suspension or revocation.

Any person or corporation violating any of the provisions of the foregoing sections shall forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding twenty dollars for each offense; and any licensed owner or driver who violates any of the provisions of the foregoing sections shall, in addition to said penalty, thereupon become liable to suspension or forfeiture of his license, and may be disqualified to hold a license thereafter.

SECTION 36. Upon passage the City Clerk shall have printed in booklet form a copy of this ordinance which he shall make available to those persons coming within the purview of these rules and regulations.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Gentlemen:

The budget as recommended reflects an increase of \$673,930.61 over the 1962 figures. An analysis of the different accounts shows the following:

Personal Services and Labor	- Increase	\$617,926.45
Ordinary Maintenance	- Increase	135,162.06
Equipment	- Decrease	69,916.00
Special Items	- Decrease	<u>9,247.90</u>

Total Increase \$673,930.61

As you know, pay raises have been granted to all permanent city employees which accounts for the large increase in that account. The administration has been able to absorb over twenty-five (25) positions as a result of resignations and deaths, or this figure would have been over \$100,000 additional.

There is a substantial increase in the Health Department Budget because of the need this year for the city to pay from appropriations the actual patient cost for T. B. cases. This is the result of State Legislation last year which brought about the consolidation of County T.B. Hospitals. Although this year we must also pay to the County an assessment for last year's cost of the hospital, in the years to come the budget item will cover our complete costs for this item resulting in considerable savings.

It is interesting to note that the increase in the school budget is \$275,098.00 or just about 40% of the total.

When one realizes that the increase in pensions costs \$88,568.69 and for health and accident insurance \$130,000.00 (the city now paying 50% of the cost to employees) it can easily be seen that there has been considerable savings made in the various departments to hold the total increase in ordinary maintenance to under \$70,000.00.

It is a pleasure to announce that the cost of reducing our funded debt has been reduced \$51,000.00.

To hold this budget to the figures presented has required considerable study and cooperation from all departments. It is my sincere belief that the Honorable Board of Aldermen will find this same cooperation from Department Heads as they study the figures. I am confident that whatever cuts the Board makes will be done judiciously and that the finished budget will be adequate to serve the people of the city.

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Somerville as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter XXVIII, Section 3, of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Somerville is hereby amended by striking out said Section 3 in its entirety and inserting in place thereof the following new Section 3:

"Section 3. All wires, appliances and apparatus in the interior of a public building or a private premises which are intended for the transmission of electricity and to be connected with outside circuit shall be arranged, affixed, changed and maintained by the person owning or using same to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Electric Lines and Lights, who shall have access at all

reasonable times to such wires, appliances and apparatus. No person shall place such wires, appliances or apparatus in any building in process of construction until all gas, steam, sewer, water and furnace pipes have been placed in proper position. Before any person shall affix or change any such wires, appliances or apparatus, he shall notify said Superintendent who shall be given ample opportunity to inspect the same and no wire, appliance or apparatus shall be covered or enclosed before such inspection. If work is not in progress at the expiration of thirty days from the date of issue, permits will be voidable at the option of the Superintendent. The charge of \$1.00 will be made in each case for each additional inspection that is made necessary by defective work or other reasons for which the contractor may be held responsible.

Where the amount of work installed is greater than the amount in the application for the permit, so that an additional fee is due, the work will not be approved until such fee is paid. Inspections will be made only upon written request to the Superintendent.

The following requirements must be complied with before final approval by the Superintendent will be given:

- (a) Conduit only to be used on all outside work.
- (b) No watt hour meter servicing a building or structure shall be located outside of said building or structure.
- (c) Service entrance switches, side operated, to be located in a readily accessible place inside a building or structure immediately adjacent to a window or door."

The Boston and Maine Railroad has failed to pay its 1962 taxes on time. As I stated a year ago, in my opinion, it is not fair to add to the burden of the home owner for this delinquency on the part of the Boston and Maine Railroad.

Last year the city took tax title to this property, and taking advantage of the provisions of Chapter 49, Acts of 1933, as amended, of the State Laws, borrowed from the state in anticipation of the payment. The interest the city paid the state for this loan was \$5,265.83. The interest paid to the city by the Boston and Maine Railroad because of their late payment of taxes was \$16,732.40 or \$11,466.57 more than the cost of the loan.

Orders of your Honorable Board dated June 18, 1963 were received by this department and the following action taken;

- 1: "Investigate need of a combination police and fire alarm box at Conwell Avenue and Hillsdale Road". I find no need of a police signal box at this location; Box 515 is located at Conwell Avenue and West Adams Street which is within 30 yards of the suggested location. The need for a Fire alarm box could best be answered by the Fire Chief.
- 2: "That the Chief of Police assign the traffic squad to Walnut Street in the vicinity of Wellington Avenue during the day and evening hours". The Selective Enforcement Unit of the Traffic Division has been directed to "Operate at various areas of the city which are determined to be high incidence areas of improper operation of motor vehicles." They are to concentrate their efforts toward the prevention of dangerous driving, motor vehicles being operated with defective equipment, and violations of the motor laws and rules and regulations. The objective of this effort is to keep our highways safe arteries for the convenience of the motoring public and our pedestrians; and to further safeguard our young people from traffic hazards during the summer months. One Unit commences its tour of duty at 7 A.M. and the second Unit terminates its tour of duty at 11 P.M. You can be assured that adequate enforcement will be exercised on Walnut Street at the time stated.
- 3: "That the Mayor and Chief of Police have the Northeastern Junior High School patrolled at night, due to the breakage and vandalism and the gathering of children in the door-way after dark". The Northeastern Junior High School and other schools throughout the city have been under constant surveillance by the patrol divisions and the crime prevention officers of this department. Extensive damage was caused to the Northeastern on two occasions during the past school period. The persons responsible for the damage were apprehended by crime prevention officers and court action was instituted. The most effective method of dealing with the offenders is now being determined by the court. I heartily endorse the "Civic Pride Program" through education which was suggested by your Honorable Board for adoption by the school department. If this program was a success it would go far toward preventing damage to property in the future. In the interim patrols will be assigned to the buildings.
- 3: "That the Mayor and the Chief of Police immediately appoint ten (10) police officers to fill all existing vacancies".

The proper utilization, assignment, and activities of the patrol and traffic officers of this department is largely controlled by the necessity of proper school

traffic supervision. A survey conducted in early 1963 showed a need for supervision at forty-two school crossing points. These were supervised by police officers during the past school year. If your Honorable Board would see fit to institute a School Traffic Supervisor Unit thus releasing police officers for other important duties, a great step forward would be made. Better trained officers through a continuous in-training program; a more comprehensive crime prevention program; a motor vehicle drivers safety and education program; and an expanded youth protection program would be realized. The present need is not for 10 additional officers but for a unit of School Traffic Supervisors.

In accordance with your Order dated June 27, 1963 re: "The feasibility of placing within the jurisdiction of the Police Taxi Bureau the regulation of private ambulance services operating within the city"; a thorough study was made and the following determination was arrived at.

The authority to regulate carriages and vehicles used within the City of Somerville (with certain exceptions not pertinent) is given to the city government by Section twenty-two of Chapter forty of the General Laws of Massachusetts. This authority could embrace private ambulances operating within the city and the regulation thereto adopted by the Board of Aldermen could be enforced by the Taxi Bureau of the Police Department.

I am enclosing a model ordinance for your consideration which I hope will be helpful in resolving this problem.

In conclusion, it is my opinion that the public convenience and necessity requires private ambulance service within the City of Somerville, that the present service being supplied therein is of excellent quality and offered in a spirit of community interest with the highest degree of cooperation.

Gentlemen:

All preliminary work has been completed with reference to a specific initial program for School Consolidation within the City. There is now general approval throughout the City to go forward with the construction of an eight (8) room addition to the Cummings School on School Street to alleviate the crowded conditions at the Carr and Pope Elementary Schools and to take the Elementary classes from the Southern Junior High School. Also, the initial step toward consolidation entails the construction of a twenty four (24) classroom school at the Wood's Playground site to replace the Cholerton, Burns and Morse Schools. Each of these schools has served the youth of the City for over three quarters of a century - the Burns School is 77 years old, the Cholerton is 83 years old and the Morse School is 94 years old.

To get this program into the building stage, it is now necessary to have the approval and authorization of the Honorable Board of Aldermen to finance the planning of the actual buildings, to acquire the building sites and to actually construct and equip the schools. Although the initial cost of construction has to be borne entirely by the City, the State will reimburse us annually from 30 to 40% of the repayment costs, depending on the formula decided on by the State School Building Assistance Commission. By spreading the cost of these buildings over a twenty year span the effect annually on our tax rate will be held to a minimum.

Therefore, I respectfully request the Honorable Board of Aldermen to pass the following order prepared by Bond Attorneys and giving the City full authorization to proceed with this first step in the program to provide modern, efficient, school facilities for the education of the youth of our city:

"Ordered, that the sum of Two Million Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$2,250,000) is appropriated for site acquisition, for constructing, originally equipping and furnishing an addition to the Cummings School and a new elementary school; and that to meet this appropriation the treasurer is authorized to issue Two Million Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$2,250,000) bonds or notes of the city under Chapter 645 of the Acts of 1948 as amended."
